KNOW YOUR CLIMATE ZONE

SELECT CLIMATE-APPROPRIATE PLANTS

Many species of grass and other plants require very little water.

ADD POLLINATOR PLANTS

Add plants that attract, feed and provide habitat for our pollinator friends -- bees, birds and butterflies -- to grow your landscape ecosystem.

WATER WISELY

Only water when necessary. Let your lawn go dormant and turn brown during times of less water. It will "green up" when the rains come.

MIX NATIVE & ADAPTIVE PLANT SPECIES

Balance our man-made cities and suburbs and its concrete and asphalt with both native and climate-appropriate, adaptive plants, which can handle people and pet traffic.
